SUNDT EXPANDS TEXAS OPERATIONS WITH OPENING OF SAN ANTONIO OFFICE

Alamo City considered the natural choice to grow regional presence, continue decades of Texas projects

SAN ANTONIO, Texas (June 8, 2010) – Sundt Construction, Inc. has expanded its Texas operations, opening an office in San Antonio to collaborate with local leaders on future building, concrete, federal, heavy civil and industrial projects. The San Antonio Sundt team will move into their permanent offices at 911 Central Parkway North, Suite 375, in the end of July.

“Based on the research we’ve conducted and the projects we have underway, San Antonio was our first choice because of its strong business climate and quality of life,” said Senior Vice President and Texas District Manager John Carlson, DBIA, who was promoted to lead the San Antonio office. “San Antonio is also the No. 1 metro economy in the country according to *Business Week Magazine*.” *Business Week Magazine*’s ranking is founded on statistics from the Brookings Institution that are specific to growth, employment and housing prices.

Sundt is no newcomer to the Texas market. The company’s San Antonio expansion comes on the heels of 40 years and \$1 billion of project work throughout the Lone Star State, as well as multiple projects underway worth approximately \$450 million at the following military installations in Texas: Fort Sam Houston in San Antonio; Fort Bliss in El Paso; and Fort Hood in Killeen.

Sundt has also completed dorm and fitness center renovation projects at Lackland Air Force Base. In Dallas, the company has had an office in Dallas for many years, and completed work on one of the city’s landmark projects, Reunion Tower, which is a prominent feature and the 15th tallest building in the Dallas skyline.

“In light of our past and present project work, as well as the region’s projected growth, expanding the Texas team by moving to San Antonio made perfect sense for Sundt,” Carlson added.

The new San Antonio team includes Senior Project Manager Bob Aniol, a San Antonio native; Senior Project Manager Ben Martin, a Texas native; Director of Dispute Resolution Dave Fleming, a San Antonio native; Business Development Representative Amy King, who has 20 years of construction experience in Texas, six of which have been in San Antonio; Preconstruction Project Manager Jonathan McKelvain, a Texas native; and Office Manger Abigail Shaver, a San Antonio native.

“We’re very excited about our team’s depth of industry knowledge and experience in the Texas market,” Carlson said, adding that the San Antonio location will be full-service office, handling building, heavy civil, federal, industrial and mining, and sustainable and alternate energy projects.

In addition to the new San Antonio location, Sundt has offices in Tempe and Tucson, Ariz.;

San Diego and Sacramento, Calif.; and Reno, Nev. The company builds a variety of projects for both public and private clients throughout the United States, including commercial and institutional structures; infrastructure projects such as highways, dams, pipelines and airport facilities; and facilities for the Department of Defense and other Federal agencies.

Sundt traces its roots back 120 years to a small construction company in New Mexico founded by a Norwegian immigrant named Mauritz Martinsen Sundt. The company moved to Arizona in 1929, and has been growing and doing work locally, regionally and nationally ever since. Sundt is entirely owned by its approximately 1,300 employees.
